Behaviour at Bearwood

At Bearwood Primary School, our behaviour policy is underpinned by the therapeutic thinking approach. There are lots of misunderstandings about this approach. Please see a summary of what the policy is and is not:

- The school sets high expectations for the behaviour of all children.
- All children are expected to follow the school's rules.
- The ultimate aim of the policy is to develop all of our children to intrinsically make the right choices to ensure positivity and happiness amongst the whole.
- As much as possible, the school pre-empts possible poor behaviour. We think carefully about the structure of the day, playtimes, activities the children will engage in and the structure of lessons.
- Consequences are implemented where children find making positive choices challenging. These consequences are carefully chosen to be a learning experience for the children, with the expectation that they will ensure right choices next time.
- For children who have significant difficulty, individualised plans are put in place. These plans are reviewed as regularly as once a fortnight to ensure they are fit for purpose.
- The school has a no tolerance approach to bullying, and this policy does not conflict with that.
- Children are not expected to accommodate poor behaviour from other children. They are most certainly not expected to tolerate being bullied by any child, including a child who has particular special needs.

Next week, we will share some of the consequences that can be implemented, and how they have worked.

Mrs Shaw to retire



It is with great sadness we have to share that Mrs Shaw will be retiring at the end of this term. Mrs Shaw has been a dedicated teacher at Bearwood since January 2007. She has taught nearly all year groups in the school. Most recently, she has been class teacher in KS1. Mrs Shaw has been instrumental in the significant improvements in KS1 in recent years, placing the key stage in a very strong place with excellent progress and attainment from the children before they move to KS2. Mrs Shaw has also supported the school in many extra-curricular events. She attends and supports with PTA events. She plays a lead role in nurturing our school choir. She has also been key to our success with country dancing, including the maypole dancing - particularly helping to support with our annual performance at the Winnersh Summer Fete. I am sure you will all join me in ensuring Mrs Shaw has a fantastic last few weeks at Bearwood.



Free School Meals



Are you entitled?

Free school meals and extra funding for your child's education

Across the UK more than 10 per cent of pupils who are eligible for free school meals do not register to get them.

We want to make sure 100 per cent of our pupils claim when they can in Wokingham Borough.

Importantly, it also means schools can get additional funding to support pupils.

To qualify, your child must be in school and you must be receiving one of the following benefits:

- [Income support](#)
- Income based [Job Seekers Allowance](#)
- Income related [Employment and Support Allowance](#)
- [NASS support](#)
- Guarantee element of [State Pension](#)
- [Child Tax Credit](#), provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- [Working Tax Credit](#) for the four weeks after employment ends
- [Universal Credit](#), provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400

If this applies to you but your child isn't registered for free school meals, complete a form and return it to your child school.

Bearwood Big Walk!


