Optional homework tasks - choose some activities to complete in your homework exercise book:

<p><u>English</u></p> <p>Write a story about a boy or a girl travelling back to the Stone Age and living in a dark cave. Remember the story must have a clear beginning, middle and end and should include interesting words for the reader.</p>	<p><u>Maths</u></p> <p><u>How Old?</u></p> <p>Cherri, Saxon, Mel and Paul are friends. They are all different ages: 5,6,7 and 8 years old.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">5 6 7 8</p> <p>Can you find out the age of each friend? Use these clues to help you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Saxon's age is an even number.</li> <li>• Mel and Paul's ages added together are double Saxon's age.</li> <li>• Mel's age is half of Cherri and Saxon's ages added together.</li> <li>• Mel and Paul's ages are both odd numbers.</li> </ul>
<p><u>English</u></p> <p>Create a haiku about the start of Autumn including the changes to the weather and the colour of the leaves. Remember, a haiku has three lines. There can be any number of words, but there must be 5 syllables in the first line, 7 syllables in the second line and 5 syllables in the third line. They do not usually rhyme.</p>	<p><u>History</u></p> <p>Find out about what food people in the Stone Age ate. What did they have to do to find their food? How did they prepare and cook it? Design a Stone Age menu including a starter, main course and dessert.</p>
<p><u>History</u></p> <p>Can you use different junk modelling materials at home to create a Stone Age weapon such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- A sword</li> <li>- An axe</li> <li>- A spear</li> <li>- A hammerstone</li> </ul>	<p><u>English</u></p> <p>Write a book review for a book that you have been reading. Include a summary of the story:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. What you liked about the story</li> <li>2. What you did not like</li> <li>3. Whether you would recommend it to someone else</li> </ol>
<p><u>Science</u></p> <p>How many different types of rock can you find outside near your home? Can you find gravel, concrete, tarmac, bricks, roof tiles? Which rocks are naturally occurring and which are man-made?</p>	<p><u>Art</u></p> <p>Draw a portrait of yourself or someone in your family. Try applying these techniques to create different tones:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-shading</li> <li>-cross hatching</li> <li>-smudging</li> </ul>
