This half term the topics are 'Our World' and 'Weather'. We will be carrying out weather diaries throughout this half term to help us understand different weather patterns throughout this season. ### Times Tables Rock Stars

Times Tables Rock Stars is suitable for learners aged 6 years and up (Year 2 onwards). The question-based games automatically adapt to each child's unique learning needs, helping them to recall their times tables in record speed. ### Reading

In Year 1, the children take part in a daily reading workshop from 9am. This is an opportunity for the children to practise the skills needed to become competent readers and it also enables the teachers to hear the children read.

In Year 2, the children take part in daily shared reading lessons from 9am. This is a whole class approach for teaching reading skills and comprehension. Some children may need to be heard to read on a 1:1 basis more frequently where as others, the daily shared reading lesson is sufficient. We continuously assess the children's skills and provide the support they need as individual learners.

#### Playground Games

We are continuously thinking of ways to enhance provision during break times on the playground. The children have access to trikes, bikes and scooters. We are reminding the children about the importance of playground safety, ensuring they are careful with their eyes, hands and feet! We also have some outdoor equipment such as tennis rackets, skipping ropes and hula hoops in our shed which, we get out daily weather permitting. If you have anything at home that you no longer use/need and you feel it would be suitable for use on our playground, we would be grateful for donations.
