Message from Mrs Christine Jeater, the Chair of Governors

As Chair of Governors, I frequently visit Bearwood and walk round all classrooms. I came in last Wednesday and found that all classes were working well, children were focused and engaged and there was a sense of calm in the classrooms. The teaching and learning environment was excellent. I have been walking round the classrooms for years and this was the best visit overall. Following on from a great Ofsted Report and outstanding SATs results we are set for a good year in school.

We are planning to hold another parent forum prior to Christmas and I would urge as many of you to come as possible. We want to hear your views and share and discuss our future plans for the school.



Start of Day

The official start to the school day is **8:45am**. Thank you to all families who ensure their children are in school on time. In order to enable a smooth start to the day, we operate a soft-start. This means children can come into school from 8:35 to 8:45am. For health and safety reasons, we are not able to have families wait on the KS2 playground at the start of the day, because the car-park is in use until 8:30am. Our KS2 children therefore enter via the KS2 gate between 8:35 and 8:45am. We understand some of our KS2 families have expressed concern about the congestion at the KS2 gate at 8:35am. We strongly recommend to our families that you utilise this 10-minute margin to select the best time for your child, helping to ensure there is not too much congestion at the gate.

Are you entitled?

Free school meals and extra funding for your child's education Across the UK more than 10 per cent of pupils who are eligible for free school meals do not register to get them.

We want to make sure 100 per cent of our pupils claim when they can in Wokingham Borough.

Importantly, it also means schools can get additional funding to support pupils.

To qualify, your child must be in school and you must be receiving one of the following benefits:

- Income support
- Income based <u>Job Seekers Allowance</u>
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance
- NASS support
- Guarantee element of <u>State Pension</u>
- Child Tax Credit, provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit for the four weeks after employment ends
- <u>Universal Credit</u>, provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400

If this applies to you but your child isn't registered for free school meals, complete a form and return it to your child school.

For children who are already over 5, it's not too late – our scheme is flexible! As well as being able to register and make payment straight away, you can join and cancel the scheme at any time. We offer yearly, termly and half termly payment periods and a recurring payment option to give you one less thing to remember.
