

Journeys

Can you remember the key features of a Concorde? Write a list of facts.	Think of a journey you have been on before. How did you travel there? Can you write a recount of your journey?	Can you make a model of an aeroplane? You can use homemade play-dough, recycled materials like water bottles/cereal boxes and paper.
Imagine you are Neil Armstrong and you are travelling to the moon on a rocket! What would the journey be like? What would happen when you get there? How would you move on the moon?	In Science, you will be learning about basic needs and survival. Create a poster with information on hygiene, survival (water, food, air) and shelter.
