

Statutory Assessments in Reception

- Reception Baseline Assessment (RBA) at the beginning of the year
- Early Years Foundation Stage Profile (EYFSP) at the end of the year

Reception Outcomes 2022...

- 83% of our Reception children attained the Early Learning Goals (ELGs) in Reading, Writing and Maths.
- 76% of our Reception children attained a 'Good Level of Development' (GLD)

- Home time is at 3pm. Parents collect children from the EYFS gate in the KS1 playground.










Parents as First Educators

- Close communication between home and school is vital to supporting a happy time in school for your child. Please email or call the school office and they will pass on any messages, if you are not able to speak to staff directly, and we will respond as soon as we are able to do so.
- Reading at home Every day. We will send home a reading book once a week for your child to practise applying their phonics learning. Please read lots of other books with your children to develop their love of reading.
- Parent workshops and parent evenings
- Stay and Play sessions details to follow
- Input in children's learning profiles. We so enjoy seeing your additions to your child's Tapestry online learning journal. Please add observations of learning activities and special occasions so that we can develop our knowledge of all their experiences and interests.
- Special events this term Family member visitors
- Talk about learning at home. See our Curriculum Map; our topic is 'Marvellous Me'. Talk to your child about how they have grown and all that they can do.
- Please email in a baby and/or toddler photo of your child for our topic activities this term.





Attendance

Every day in Reception really does count. If your child misses a day, they will miss out on lots of learning, and will need to catch-up when they return.

Other little important things that make all the difference...

- A non-spill, child-friendly water bottle every day
- Send them with child-friendly, self-help clothes and shoes so that your child can develop their independence and confidence
- Help them to learn to dress and undress themselves
- Label everything and show your child where to look for the label
- Prepare your child that they will be expected to use the toilet independently
- Discuss their dinner choice with them beforehand, if they are having a school lunch option
- Pack healthy food if your child is bringing a packed lunch, with child-friendly packaging that they can open and manage themselves, to promote independence and confidence
